

In 2015, SMART Myanmar, a project funded by the European Union and co-funded by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development, organized a meeting of 17 European brands and retailers, to promote responsible manufacturing practices, especially the project launched the Myanmar Garment Manufacturers Association's first-ever Code of Conduct for member factories, and linked interested European buyers with garment exporters in Myanmar able to comply with international standards of social compliance

Inspired by this earlier conference, SMART Myanmar organized in 2018 a "Myanmar Buyers' Forum" for the garment and textile industry. Last year's conference was also organized in cooperation with the DFID-funded Business Innovation Facility project. From the SMART Myanmar project consortium, partners sequa gGmbH, the Myanmar Garment Manufacturers Association (MGMA) and the Foreign Trade Association of German Retailers (AVE) jointly organized and planned a 2-day agenda focused on giving space for brand & retailers to discuss topics jointly and an opportunity to hear insights from diverse stakeholders based in Myanmar on the following day.

The **2019 Myanmar Buyers' Forum** will once again gather together brands & retailers in Yangon to discuss issues related to Myanmar's economic growth, responsible product sourcing and joint efforts to promote sustainable consumption and production practices across the Myanmar garment, textile and footwear industries.
